Third Tradition Checklist

1. In my mind, do I prejudge some new AA members as losers?
 2. Is there some kind of alcoholic whom I privately do not want in my AA group?
 3. Do I set myself up as a judge of whether a newcomer is sincere or phony?
 4. Do I let language, religion (or lack of it), race, education, age, or other such things interfere with my carrying the message?
 5. Am I overimpressed by a celebrity? By a doctor, a clergyman, an ex-convict? Or can I just treat this new member simply and naturally as one more sick human, like the rest of us?
- When someone turns up at AA needing information or help (even if he can't ask for it aloud), does it really matter to me what he does for a living? Where he lives? What his domestic arrangements are? Whether he has been to AA before? What his other problems are?

Concept III Checklist

- Do we understand what is meant by the "Right of Decision"? Do we grant it at all levels of service or do we "instruct"?
- Do we trust our trusted servants — G.S.R., D.C.M., area delegate, the Conference itself?

March 2011 Delegate's Report

Dear Fellow Trusted Servants,

By the time you have read this article, NERAASA will be upon us (or maybe past), and I will have received the background material for the agenda of the 61st General Service Conference.

My plan to hear your voices is to ask DCMs and Service Committee Chairs to review various parts of the background information with their Districts and Committees *prior* to the April Day of Sharing. At the Day of Sharing, we will have breakout groups (in the morning) to have further discussion on the topics; and, in the afternoon we will hear your feedback, and possibly have additional discussions (if needed).

As a parallel to our Day of Sharing, I will distribute a questionnaire for our members to provide further comment and perspectives on selected Conference agenda items.

I am reminded by those involved in our Legacy of Service that it is important in all these discussions that we always make reference to the Twelve Concepts of World Service – specifically Concept XII:

“In all its proceedings, the General Service Conference shall observe the spirit of the A.A. Tradition, taking great care that the Conference never becomes the seat of perilous wealth or power; that sufficient operating funds, plus an ample reserve, be its prudent financial principle; that none of the Conference Members shall ever be placed in a position of unqualified authority over any of the others; that all important decisions be reached by discussion, vote, and whenever possible, by substantial unanimity; that no Conference action ever be personally punitive or an incitement to public controversy; that though the Conference may act for the service of Alcoholics Anonymous, it shall never perform any acts of government; and that, like the Society of Alcoholics Anonymous which it serves, the Conference itself will always remain democratic in thought and action.”

When you receive this information, please feel free to share all of this information with your homegroup and others interested in service. In addition, I encourage all members to participate in the process leading up to the General Service Conference -- and as importantly -- to engage in the discussions throughout the year on matters affecting AA as a whole. At the May Assembly, I will provide a report back on what occurred during the week of Conference.

Lastly, this year, there is an additional regional event that is available to all members of our fellowship. It is the Northeast Regional Forum (NERF) to be held the weekend of May 20-22, 2011 at the Sturbridge Host Hotel & Conference Center, Sturbridge, Massachusetts. Representatives of the General Service Board and members of the General Service Office and Grapevine staff will be present at the Forum to share experience, respond to questions and hear suggestions. It will be a weekend of lively participation for all concerned.

Regional Forums originated in 1975 at the suggestion of Dr. Jack Norris, then Chair of the General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous. They were to be weekend sharing and informational sessions designed to help the General Service Board, A.A. World Services, Inc., the Grapevine Corporate Board, the Grapevine Staff, and the General Service Office Staff stay in touch with A.A. members, trusted servants and newcomers to service throughout the A.A. service structure. There is no registration fee for Regional Forums or Additional Regional Forums. The General Service Board covers the expenses of meeting rooms. Important Message from the Area

The Seventh Tradition (long form)

The A.A. groups themselves ought to be fully supported by the voluntary contributions of their own members. We think that each group should soon achieve this ideal; that any public solicitation of funds using the name of Alcoholics Anonymous is highly dangerous, whether by groups, clubs, hospitals, or other outside agencies; that acceptance of large gifts from any source, or of contributions carrying any obligation whatever, is unwise. Then too, we view with much concern those A.A. treasuries which continue, beyond prudent reserves, to accumulate funds for no stated A.A. purpose. Experience has often warned us that nothing can so surely destroy our spiritual heritage as futile disputes over property, money, and authority.

Dear Trusted Servant,

We are writing today to remind the Districts, Groups and individual members of HMB Area 48 of the importance of contributions to the Area, and to urge you to be as generous as possible in these last couple and first few months of the year, when our expenses are highest. *Certainly, the most critical point to this letter is that at this time, the Area treasury is close to prudent reserve with many expenses coming up. In order for us to continue our service efforts, we are asking for your support. Please share this letter with your home groups and other groups in your Districts.*

We are excited about the many opportunities for service at the Area level. All of the officer and committee chair service positions are filled for 2010-11, putting us in a strong position to carry the message of AA to the still-suffering alcoholic. Through Correctional Facilities to Special Needs to Treatment Facilities, to name just three committees, the Area brings the message of hope to people who don't have ready access to the Fellowship.

The monetary contributions from the Districts and Groups in our geographically large Area are what make these services possible. The basis of all service – one alcoholic talking to another – cannot be valued in dollars, thank goodness, but setting up and running the service structure to allow that to happen does require contributions. It is where money and spirituality mix.

For the Area, the first two months of the year is when many of the largest bills are due. These include the semi-annual allocations to the Area Delegate and Area Chair to travel, attend conferences, arrange mailings and do the myriad other things required of them; paying once-yearly fees for archives storage, insurance and meeting book printing; and helping defray costs for officers and committee chairs to attend the Northeast Regional Alcoholics Anonymous Service Assembly (NERAASA), which vastly improves their ability to do their jobs.

E-mail distribution will be those e-mails listed for the GSRs or group contacts in Fellowship New Vision (FNV) and those members of the fellowship that provide their e-mail addresses.

Background: Printing and shipping costs are a substantial burden to the Area. In addition to the financial considerations, it is becoming increasingly customary for organizations to move away from paper to an electronic format. This is for a number of reasons. First, electronic media permit the transmission of a greater amount of information at minimal cost. Second, we will be able to provide links and other extensions to the newsletter through electronic media. Finally, the cost of printing and shipping the newsletter is a substantial cost to the area: given the opportunity to deliver a superior product and direct our limited resources elsewhere, I hope you will all consider this a worthwhile proposal.

This year Area 48 is hosting this annual AA service event, which rotates throughout the 4 delegate areas of New York State. Originally started in Area 48 in 1980 as a one-day event with a focus on Public Information and Institutions (Corrections and Treatment), this event quickly became a weekend event. Held in Albany, NY for the first three years, the event has rotated throughout the state at the request of the other areas.

There will be panels on PI, CPC, Corrections, Treatment, and Special Needs. In addition, there will be roundtables both nights for these committees, as well as displays by Archives, Grapevine, and Literature.
